Thai refugees make phone calls worldwide, body recovery center able to digitally send pictures via network to ID center



Bob Schena, Chairman and CEO of Rajant Corporation, is proud to announce that Rajant has taken an active role in aiding the tsunami disaster relief effort. This month, Rajant sent two employees along with company equipment to the city of Phuket, Thailand.

Barry McElroy and Chad Bowen arrived in Thailand in early January along with several faculty members of the Naval Postgraduate School. Once onsite, they were able to establish portable, wireless networks in the Bang Muang refugee camp and the Young Yao Temple identification and reclamation center. Despite the absence of any existing telecommunications infrastructure, the BreadCrumb® systems were set-up and operational very quickly. The networks utilized a satellite uplink to provide much needed wireless broadband access and internet reachback capability. The BreadCrumb® networks have supported 60

to 70 simultaneous users at any given time with the majority of them using Internet Voice over IP (VoIP) calling services to make phone calls all over the world. In the identification and reclamation center, the network provided the capability to send DNA information back to the US for body identification. The network in the refugee camp provided medical personnel and camp administrators access to the internet as well as provided communication capabilities to friends and family for those searching for missing relatives.

Users of the network include the Royal Thai Army, refugees, non-governmental relief agencies, and fellow aid supporters. There has been exceptional feedback regarding the quality of connection and users have expressed appreciation for the internet and phone capability. Barry and Chad have returned from Thailand but the company equipment will remain indefinitely, or until it is no longer needed by the Royal Thai Army in the relief effort.
